
All are welcome at Christ's table. Ushers will direct you down the center aisle.

- Place wine/juice cups in the tray as you return to your pew.



Beloved Good Shepherd,

I'm excited to share that on August 1st I started a new position as Campus Minister with LuMin (Lutheran Campus Ministries) in La, Crosse, WI. LuMin is a ministry of the La Crosse Area Synod that draws students from the University of Wisconsin—La Crosse, Western Technical College, and Viterbo University. I'm excited to begin this call and my vocation in full time ministry.

In the ELCA, clergy are required to serve a three-year call in a congregation as their first call. Because this is my first call and LuMin is not a congregational call, but instead a call to a specialized ministry, this call needs special permission from the ELCA Conference of Bishops. I ask for your prayers to be with the Roster Committee and the Bishops of the ELCA as they consider my request to be ordained into specialized ministry. When and if the exception is granted, I look forward to my ordination at Good Shepherd!

As I begin my first call, I want to express my continued gratitude for Good Shepherd. It is clear that so much of my formation for Word and Sacrament ministry came in and through Good Shepherd. This includes the opportunity to serve as your Director for Children, Youth, and Family ministry, as well as the partnership we had for one year with Luther College Campus Ministry, which greatly equipped me for this call to serve LuMin in La Crosse.

My prayers continue to go with you, Good Shepherd, during this interim time as you await the call of your next pastor.

Close the door gently.

This is the phrase my wonderful colleague in ministry, Pr. Steve Jacobsen, used to announce his retirement from First Lutheran in 2010. It is a beautiful description of the important transition that must take place when a pastor — even a short-term pastor — steps down from pastoral ministry in a congregation.

I find that I need to "close the door gently" and allow time and distance to help me readjust to life as a member of the congregation, and not as your pastor. John and I will be apart from our beloved community here at Good Shepherd for a period of time. You will carry on with the extraordinary ministry that you have been doing and continue to do. Soon, Pr. April Larson will begin serving you with all her depth of wisdom, love, and experience. And I will join you in praying that the day when we can welcome our new "settled" pastor.
