


#### SECOND READING: Ephesians 4:1-7, 11-13

<sup>25</sup>When they found him on the other side of the sea, they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you come here?" <sup>26</sup>Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. <sup>27</sup>Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal." <sup>28</sup>Then they said to him, "What must we do to perform the works of God?" <sup>29</sup>Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent." <sup>30</sup>So they said to him, "What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? ## 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering

#### Created to Be....Brave, Authentic, Free, Disruptive, Disciples

On Sunday evening, July 28<sup>th</sup>, about 50 of us gathered in the Fellowship to enjoy ice cream sundaes and to hear the stories from the students who attended the Gathering in New Orleans. Our 12 young people, along with our Youth and Family Director, Kelli, were part of the 97 youth and chaperones who attended from Decorah. They joined a total of 16,000 young people from across the ELCA, coming from as far south as Puerto Rico, and as far north as Alaska.

It was a joy and a delight to hear the kids talk about each of the five days of the Gathering. They shared what some of their favorite activities were, and talked about how much they enjoyed the evening gatherings with bands and inspirational speakers.

The adults who supported these young people were eager to ask questions, and to share their own experiences of attending youth gatherings way back in the 1950s! What a long and wonderful tradition the ELCA as it regularly hosts the largest youth gatherings from across all the mainline protestant denominations.

We closed the evening with a beautiful prayer that we will share in worship today.
