





FIRST READING: Isaiah 43:1-7



SECOND READING: Acts 8:14-17

Peter and John are sent to support the new Christians in Samaria, a group that was recently baptized after hearing the good news of Christ through the preaching of Philip. Here the Samaritans receive the gift of the Holy Spirit in the laying on of hands.

¹⁴ Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. ¹⁵ The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit ¹⁶ (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). ¹⁷ Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

The reading opens with questions about the identity of the Messiah. John the Baptist insists that he is not the Messiah; instead, he points ahead to one who is coming. And whether the voice of God was heard by all or only by Jesus, God settles the matter: Jesus is God's beloved Son.

¹⁵ As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, ¹⁶ John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷ His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

²¹ Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, ²² and the Holy Spirit


descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."


- Worshippers are welcome to kneel or stand at the Altar Rail

- Place wine/juice cups in the tray as you return to your pew.















TODAY, SUNDAY, JANUARY 12th is the actual date and 15th anniversary of the 2010 Haiti earthquake that killed more than 200,000 Haitians, along with a number of Americans, including Benjamin Splichal Larson, son of Pastors April and Judd Larson. Ben is the composer of the beloved liturgy "Behold, I Make All Things New", which we sing today in commemoration. Welcome to all of Ben's family and friends, who gather with us in worship today to remember the Haiti earthquake and celebrate Ben's life and music. Ben, his wife Renee Splichal Larson, and cousin Jonathan Larson were invited as seminarians to teach Lutheran Theology and Christology to parish pastors of the new Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti. They had just completed a week of teaching and were attending the 5 p.m. daily worship at St. Joseph's Home for Boys when the earthquake hit, and Ben died on the Resurrection Floor of the building.
