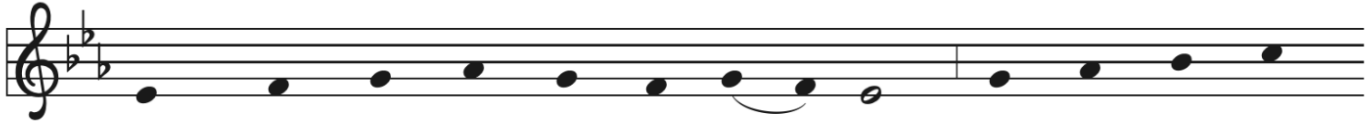
## READING: Acts 17:22-28

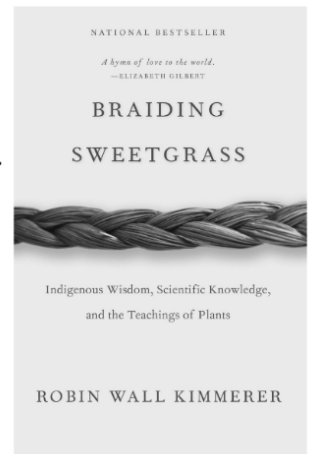
